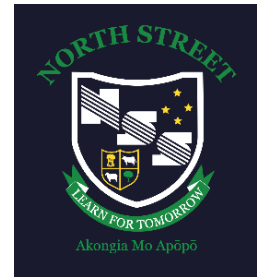


NORTH STREET SCHOOL NEWSLETTER
