Akomanga 17 Visits Pūkaha

After studying Tuna throughout Term 2, Akomanga 17 hit the road in the school van on Friday 19 June for an exciting trip to Pūkaha National Wildlife Centre, funded by our netball fundraising efforts. This excursion allowed our tamariki to see classroom learning in action and connect with what it means to be a kaitiaki (guardian). The absolute highlight was the tuna feeding session, where students observed the longfin eels in their natural habitat and learnt about their life cycle from expert rangers. Beyond the tuna, the class explored the forest and aviaries—spotting rare native birds like the kākā, hihi, and the white kiwi, Māpuna—while learning about predator control and the cultural history of the area.
